

THE GOLDEN CHARIOT KARNATAKA

- The Golden Chariot is a luxury tourist train that connects the important tourist spots in the Indian states of **Karnataka and Goa.**
- It is a **joint venture** of
 - State Government of Karnataka and Ministry of Railways.
- It is named after the "Stone Chariot in the Vitthala" Temple at Hampi.
- The Golden Chariot operates weekly and had its maiden commercial run on March 10, 2008.
- The logo of the train has a mythological animal with the head of an elephant and a body of a lion.
- It offers a mix of heritage, culture, eco-tourism and beach life

• The 19 coaches on the train are coloured **purple and gold**. 5-Feb-21 The train is operated by the **Karnataka State Tourism Development Corporation** and marketed by The Luxury Trains, whereas **The Mapple Group** handles the hospitality services on the train.

The Golden Chariot offers accommodation in **44 cabins in 11 coaches** that are named after dynasties that ruled the region:
