- Lt. Gen. Augustus Henry Lane Fox Pitt Rivers-1827-1900
- An English army officer-deeply interested in Ethnology, Anthropology & Archaeology
- Known for his innovations in archaeological methods, museum display of excavated materials & ethnographic collection
- Amassed ethnographic collections numbering to thousands of items from all over the world
- Influenced by the evolutionary writing of Charles Darwin & Herbert Spencer, he arranged them typologically & within types chronologically

- This style of arrangement, designed to highlight the evolutionary trends in human artifacts was a revolutionary innovation in museum design
- His ethnological collections form the basis of the 'Pitt Rivers Museum' at Oxford- which was a wealth of archaeological materials from Roman & Saxon periods
- His interest in archaeology began in 1850'sbecame a noted scientist while he was serving as a military officer
- His approach towards archaeological excavation was highly methodical by standards of the time & he is widely regarded as the first scientific archaeologist of England

- Most imp methodological innovation of Rivers his insistence that all artifacts, not just beautiful or unique ones, must be collected & catalogued – this focus on everyday objects as the key to understand the past, broke decisively with earlier archaeological practice, which had often verged on treasure hunting
- Described intellectual frame work for his collection & museum display, thus-'the objects with a view to show..... the successive ideas by which the minds of men in a primitive condition of culture have progressed in the development of their arts from the simple to the complex & from the homogenous to heterogenus.... Human ideas as represented by various products of human identity, are capable of classification to general species & varieties in the same manner as the products of vegetable & animal kingdoms.... If therefore, we can obtain a sufficient number of objects to represent the succession of ideas, it will be found that they are capable of being arranged in museums upon a similar plan'

- Realized the value of three dimensional recording of antiquities – which is the essence of modern excavation
- He personally supervise the diggings & insisted on recordings of the antiquities
- He brought anthropological & sociological approach to the study of pre-historic artifacts
- Glyn Daniel- 'Pitt Rivers & Flinders Petrie were responsible for the transformation of the archaeological outlook from one of curiosity to one which was frankly sociological'
- His approach explained in works like 'The Principals of Classification ', 'The Evolution of Culture: Primitive Warfare & Early Modes of Navigation'
